Dear Cap Members,

We hope that you and your family continue to be safe in this unprecedented time of the coronavirus pandemic. Cap and Gown has been closed for the fall semester, and we are waiting to hear what the University decides about the spring

semester. We are tightening our belts to endure the strain this pandemic is putting on our club finances, so this fall Cap newsletter is coming to you in digital format only for now and the foreseeable future.

The Cap and Gown Graduate Board met on October 21st for our fall meeting. In my twenty-two years on the board, I have never been so proud to see how our Cap community — our Officers, our Club Staff, our Graduate Board members, and our Alums — have responded to the challenges we are facing. Here are highlights from our board meeting:

• **Cap Goes Virtual:** Club President Karthik Ramesh, in his Undergraduate Report, described the plans for virtual recruitment of sophomores and bicker this spring. He also referenced the many virtual social events that have been organized at low cost.

- Cap Launches Career Panels: The best attended virtual events have been the Cap Career Panels organized by the triumvirate of Lisa Schmucki '74, Nina Bahadur '13, and Karthik Ramesh '21. Taking advantage of Zoom technology, alumni panelists have presented to undergraduates and young alumni in equally wide-spread locations. We are working on plans to use the recordings of these panels as part of our sophomore recruiting to highlight the value of our alumni network.
- New Board Committee on Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (DEI): Our undergraduate officers and younger graduate board members have been taking the lead to make sure that Cap, along with Princeton University, is addressing issues of systemic racism. Sean Poosson '17 and Jade Williams '19, recent club presidents and current board members, are Co-Chairs of a new Graduate Board Committee on Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (DEI). At our recent board meeting, they presented a survey the committee conducted with young alumni and current undergraduates to better understand the current climate and areas requiring attention. One area for immediate follow-up is a suggestion to conduct sensitivity training before our upcoming virtual bicker this spring. Another critical area is the subject of financial aid discussed below. We will have a special December board meeting to focus on these issues.



- Expanding Financial Aid: Under the leadership of Kasturi Shah '15, the Cap Financial Aid Committee founded in 2018, has administered Cap's first financial aid program to supplement the financial aid provided by the University for a limited number of undergraduates. In our recent board meeting, Kas presented a proposal to simplify how financial aid awards are given and a plan to create a dedicated financial aid fund to expand the amount of aid the club provides. The cornerstone of the plan will be a commitment to fund the difference between what the University calculates as the prevailing junior and senior board rate and the cost of Cap for each member on financial aid.
- Update on our Cap Staff: We closed mid-March • and thanks to the contributions of Cap members and alumni, we were able to keep all staff on payroll until mid-April, and some beyond that. Our manager of 40 vears, Dennis Normile, remains on payroll and has been overseeing the clubhouse, working on reopening plans with other club managers and the GICC, and in constant contact with our staff. The combination of paid work at the club, continuing health care, and unemployment benefits have assisted staff members in this difficult time. We are monitoring the situation closely including the continuation of government aid. Healthwise, the good news is that the three members of our current staff of sixteen who have had COVID are fully recovered.

Looking ahead to the next semester, President Eisgruber's recent email said that a University decision on the spring term will be made early in December. Even if more students return, it does not necessarily follow that the clubs will reopen. While Cap will be prepared to open on short notice, given the higher risk of COVID in indoor dining and social settings, the most likely scenario may see the clubs remaining closed until the fall 2021 semester. If the University funds a significant percentage of the clubs fixed operating expenses in the spring, as they did in the fall, the immediate solvency of the clubs is insured, but we will still have many challenges.

The undergraduate Cap membership consists of an introductory spring semester for sophomores followed by two full years in the club. Our Class of 2020 seniors missed their senior spring. The Class of 2021 missed their junior spring and senior fall. The Class of 2022 had only a few weeks of membership as new sophomore members before the University closed in March. In February, these juniors and seniors will need to run a virtual bicker and then elect new officers for next year.

The good news for the clubs is that in the middle of all this disruption, students are clamoring for the club experience. Our President Karthik Ramesh is also the President of the ICC (Inter-Club Council). The ICC conducted a survey of sophomores to gauge interest in the clubs in a virtual environment. Consistent with past levels of participation in club admissions, 75% of sophomore respondents expressed an interest in joining a club this spring, whether or not the process and membership will be virtual. The ICC and all of the clubs are working to make the most of the virtual club experience.

Conclusion

Many thanks to all of you, our generous alums who have contributed in good times, to fund our beautiful improvements to the clubhouse, and with exceptional generosity to the Annual Fund this past year, to help the club and staff in hard times.

The University provided a generous grant to each of the clubs this fall to fund a major portion of our expenses, and we are hopeful that will happen again this spring. We are debt free. Looking ahead, we will turn our attention to cost containment, financial aid, and building our Cap Endowment. This crisis shows us the importance of having an endowment for unexpected crises.

My best wishes to you and your families for health over the holidays as we celebrate in more limited ways, frequently missing the opportunity to be with those we love. With hope for a return to happier days in 2021.


As we look forward to the spring semester, we are faced with the challenge of successfully executing a virtual bicker. This year, we are leaning on Cap's




Meet the Cap and Gown Board of Trustees
